The temporary stage for use at the Sweetwater Pavilion is requested to be in place for a period of 180 days every year beginning in 2018. The stage as a temporary structure per Sec. 3103, IBC, is permitted to be in place for 90 days as stipulated in the definition for temporary structure in Rule 6, Section 2(f)(1), GAR. This time period expires on August 31, 2017 for the stage.

The temporary stage will be placed under a recently constructed outdoor membrane structure (CDR 384061). The membrane structure is used for occasional concert demonstrations of musical and sound system products. Sweetwater is a dealer in musical equipment for musicians, recording studios, schools, house of worship, concert sound companies and broadcasters.
