Conditions:

Code requires landings at least 60 inches in length to be provided at the top and bottom of ramps. An accessible route is not required, based upon the building being evaluated using Ch 34, but because this is a new ramp it must comply with code.

Facts:

- 1. An automatic door opener will be provided at the bottom of the ramp to open the doors to the exterior at the top of the ramp. This will eliminate the need for users to stop at the top of the ramp to open the doors.
- 2. An accessible route is not required to this exit, an accessible exit is provided at the main entrance.
- 3. The owner could provide code compliant stairs at this exit, but wants a ramp for equipment and deliveries.

Landings are provided to allow users to rest on a level floor surface. A door opener will be provided at the bottom of the ramp to open the exterior doors so that users do not have to stop to open the door and can continue to the exterior of the building.
