Conditions: The crew living quarters for a County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) facility (approx.1600 sq ft) will not be accessible, including, not limited to, toilets, sinks, shower facilities, sleeping rooms, kitchen elements and apparatus bay support work areas. Code requires that all newly built common use toilet and bathing facilities, and other elements be accessible. Other common use and public areas in this facility (training, restrooms, office, clerical) will be compliant.

Facts: 1. The EMS crew quarters, locker rooms, toilet and bathing facilities, kitchen, bay support areas are only intended for EMS personnel. Public is not allowed in these areas of the facility.  
2. The public will have access to other common use facilities (restroom, office, training facilities) that are code compliant.  
3. Numerous other identical accessibility variances have been approved for fire stations. (Station 10 16-01-40, Station 7 14-04-20, Station 4 12-10-12, Station 5 12-1-40, etc.)
